Process for Siting a Geological Repository

At its meeting on 29 January, the NuLeAF Steering Group (SG) considered an update on developments, including input to discussions with Government, the NDA and the regulators. The update is available at:

It is expected that a White Paper setting out the implementation framework for a geological repository will be published in the Spring. This is likely to be accompanied by an invitation from Government to local communities to express an interest in participating in the siting process.

The update to the SG includes annexes on potential steps leading to a local decision about participation (annex 2), and key questions to address in designing a local engagement programme to inform such a decision (annex 3).

Workshop on the Process of Regulatory Review of the Repository Science and Technical Programme

The Environment Agency is organising this workshop on 4 March in Manchester. The objectives are to raise awareness of the process of regulator review and identify ways of developing stakeholder confidence in the science underpinning geological disposal.

The Management of Low Level Wastes

At its meeting on 29 January, the NuLeAF Steering Group (SG) considered an update covering:

- the Low Level Waste Repository near Drigg
- arrangements for overseeing the development of NDA strategy for LLW
- preparation of a Briefing Paper for local authority planning officers
- strategy development for managing non-nuclear industry LLW.

The update includes reference to the planning permission for vault 9 at the LLWR near Drigg and agreement to the setting up of a Community Benefits Fund. The SG agreed to consider a full report on LLW management and community benefits at its meeting in April.

Comments on the draft NDA Business Plan

These comments cover:

The comments highlight concerns about current NDA funding arrangements and the need for flexibility so NDA can drive forward clean-up in ways that maintain stakeholder confidence.

Proposals for NDA Local Stakeholder Engagement Arrangements

The SG endorsed a set of proposals for local NDA engagement arrangements, particularly to improve engagement with local authorities. These proposals have been submitted to the NDA and published as Briefing Paper 12:

Future of Nuclear Power

The SG considered a report summarising the statements in the recent White Paper of relevance to its remit on waste management and decommissioning:

- continue to monitor developments with a view to seeking to ensure that they do not prejudice effective management of the nuclear legacy; and
- consider a report at its April meeting on the consultation on waste and decommissioning funding provisions guidance.

In the afternoon session of its meeting on 29 January, the SG heard presentations from British Energy on (a) its plans for radioactive waste management and decommissioning of existing plant and (b) the radioactive waste management implications of new build.
