**Subject:** Proposed amendment to Nuleaf constitution

## Introduction

Over the last year, Nuleaf has been considering whether developments in the policy landscape for nuclear decommissioning require any alteration to the made to the organisation's scope and remit.

Members felt that the organisation's remit should remain broadly unchanged, with a focus on decommissioning and legacy waste management, but with engagement in new nuclear issues where it has implications for legacy sites.

At the December 2021 Steering Group meeting it was also agreed that the work of the organisation should be extended to include occasional discussion around (a) regional energy and net zero carbon plans; and (b) nuclear Emergency Planning.

The meeting proposed that an amendment to the Nuleaf constitution should be made, at the AGM, to underpin the extension into work on regional energy and net zero carbon. Nuleaf has previously engaged to some extent in Emergency Planning and so no amendment to the constitution is required to expand work in this field.

Members are therefore invited to agree the Recommendation set out below, subject to any amendments.

## Recommendation:

That a change to the constitution is made to underpin the proposed extension of remit of the organisation as follows (new text in bold):

*3. Nuleaf's remit encompasses all aspects of the management of the UK's nuclear legacy. This includes the implications for legacy **nuclear sites and waste management of any developments that are likely to impact on that management, including proposals for new energy generation, transmission and storage infrastructure.***
